
## English

Pie Corbett, who is an incredibly intelligent man, has created a work booklet for your children to work through this week.

## Spelling

The spellings are all inspired by the Sidney Spider book. They have been set out for the children to look at the word, say the word, cover the word, write the word and then check the word... in that order 😊

I would encourage the children to practise every day if at all possible.

## Maths

In maths we are looking at making equal groups and adding equal groups together.

**Sidney's Maths making equal groups-** will look at making a selection of equal groups. The children will need to identify equal groups as well as create equal groups. The children should hopefully understand that for them to be equal, they must be the same. There are two levels in this work. Sidney's maths for a challenge and Susie's maths (the spider with the bow) for children who are ready for something a little harder. You are welcome to complete both.

**Sidney's Maths adding equal groups** will give the children an opportunity to practise their adding skills. This will also improve their 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

**BBC Bitesize-** On BBC Bitesize, there are some good activities for the children to practise 'add and subtract making 10.' Snoot and Fin are very interesting aliens...
