
The children will help The Naughty Bus to finish his story because it has all been muddled up. They will need to add new pictures and write in missing words.

<u>Maths</u>

We are moving on to Ordering Numbers to 100 and including One more and One Less.

Science

In Science, we're starting to look at the human body. I would like the children to have a go at labelling a human body in as much detail as they can. I think that the children should try to label the body first and then do some research to add further detail.

There is also an opportunity for the children to create a table which includes the hair and eye colour of family members. It would be great if they could ask as many family members as possible and see if they notice any patterns.

I have also included some instructions for making a human arm using cardboard and rubber bands which is always good fun.

Lastly, there is a research quiz for the children to find out more about the amazing people who live on the Earth.
