9. Estimating Fruit

This activity can be done with any objects you have at home, but the fruit bowl works well.

Take your fruit bowl and place up to 10 items into the bowl. Cover with a tea towel. Reveal the fruit for 10s. Then ask your child to predict how many fruits they saw. Reveal the fruit and count. How accurate was the estimate? How many out were you? Remove or add fruit and carry out the activity again.





Now you have found Africa, let's take a closer look at the continent and some of the countries there:



16. Create a fruit basket

Let's get creative... can you make a fruit basket just like Handa's? There are many ways you could do this, here are some suggestions.



Use sponges or paper, stencils of fruit to print the fruits on to/ into the basket.

Using a paper plate cut out the top half of the plate to make a basket. Cut out and colour different fruits before sticking them in place.



Draw a bowl and some fruit. Collage the fruits and basket with whatever materials you have at home.

Paper plates are so versatile. Turn them into the heads of any Wild African animal.

If you have any toilet roll tubes in your recycling bin, why not turn them into some 3D wild animals? You may need some card/ lollipop sticks for legs to support the structure.
