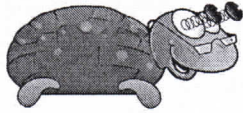


Adverbs of place



An adverb of place tells us where something is happening. An adverb of place can be one word such as 'here' or 'outside' or it can be an adverbial phrase such as 'past the shop'.
