Noun, Adjective, Verb and Adverb

Words can be grouped into different categories depending on their job in a sentence.

Nouns - There are four types of nouns.

I. Things (boy, table, pencil, frog)

2. Names of people or places (Miss Johnston, Nottingham, Barry, United Kingdom)

3. Collective groups (a herd of sheep, a class)

4. Things that cannot be seen or touched (sadness, love)

Adjectives - words that describe the noun.

A dark, gloomy cave was were the rare bat chose to live.

Verbs - these are actions words. Every sentence must have a noun and a verb.

The boy ran down the steep hill.

Adverb - describes the noun.

The boy quickly ran down the steep hill.
