Art—Option 1

Inspired by Andy Warhol's Versuvius...



I love the vibrant use of colours and the contrast. It's a really stark, eye catching piece.

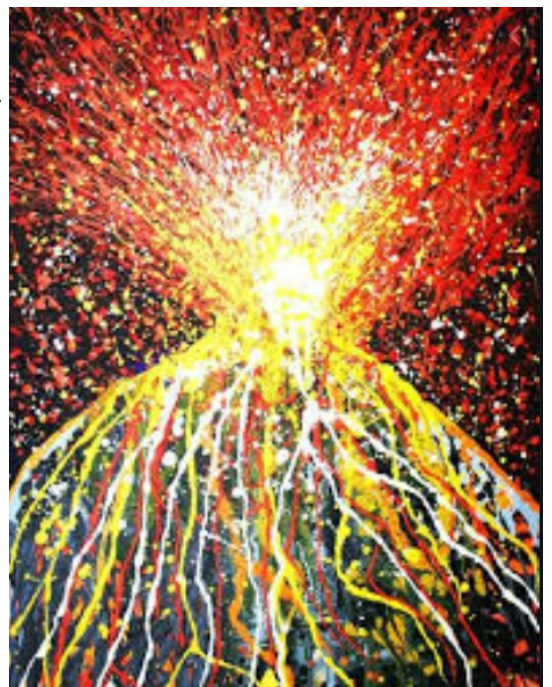
Art—Option 2

Inspired by Jackson Pollack's exploding style of painting...

This artist was famous for what looks like 'messy' painting.

His style works brilliantly for recreating a volcanic eruption, like this picture here (which is not a Pollack painting itself).

However, your parents may want you to experiment with this style outside!



Art—Option 3

Inspired by Katsushika Hokusai

This artist is famous for the 'Thirty-six views of Mount Fuji'. Each picture ensured it had Mount Fuji in the background, this is the highest mountain in Japan, at nearly 4000m, and is visible from nearly anywhere in Japan. It is a volcano, considered 'active'.



This art lends itself to watercolour and soft shades of colouring. There are a lot of shades of blue and the artist uses the white of the sheet to look like waves, snow, or cloud.
