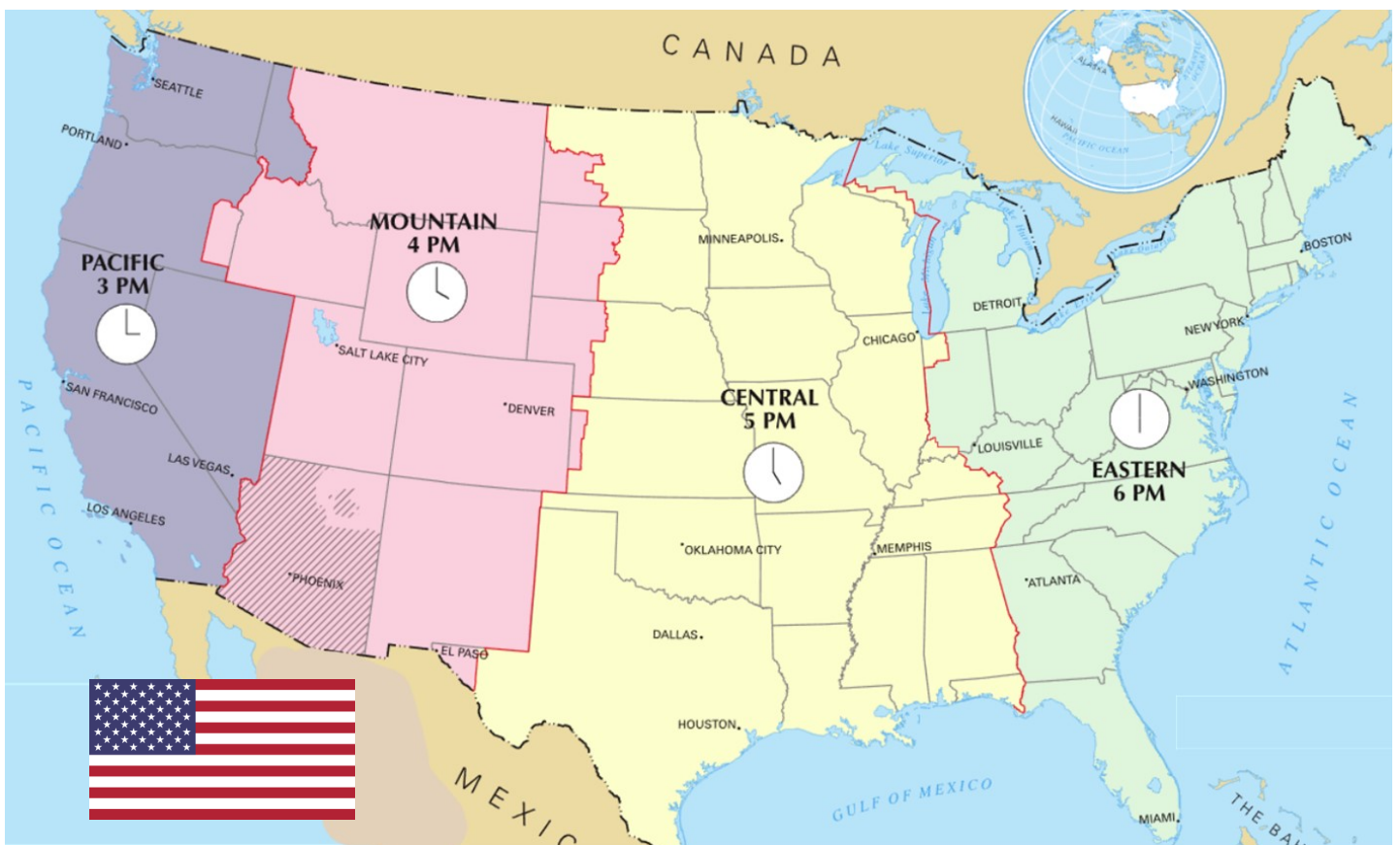

Lets have a go at learning how to *use* these time zones! We don't need to use them much ourselves, If it's 3.35pm in Keyworth, it's 3:35pm in Glasgow, Nottingham, Belfast or Truro. The United Kingdom has only one time zone so we're not used to such things. Our friends over in the USA live in a country so large that it's mainland is spread across four different time zones. This is shown on the map below. The time zones in the USA are called Eastern Time, Central Time, Mountain Time and Pacific Time.
