<p>Day 1</p> <p>Monday</p>	<p>Task 1- English</p> <p>Our learning objective: I can create a habitat for my creature.</p> <p>Your task: On Thursday, the children were tasked with creating their own creature based on The Bog Baby. Today, I would like them to create their creature's habitat. This will involve them thinking about where their creature lives and what is in its habitat to help it survive. Remember that from our science, a creature needs; air, water, food and shelter to survive.</p>	<p>Task 2- Maths</p> <p>Our learning objective: I can tell the time (o'clock, half past, quarter past/to).</p> <p>Your task: Telling the time can be very difficult but it is so important. I would like the children to practise the times they have been learning. These will include; o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to.</p>	<p>Task 3- Topic</p> <p>Our learning objective: I can compare contrasting locations- England and Thailand.</p> <p>Your task: This week the children will have an excellent time learning all about Thailand from Miss Scott who is our resident expert. The children will need to find Thailand on a map and then think about some of the countries that boarder (next to) each country.</p>

<p>Day 2 Tuesday</p>	<p>Task 1- English Our learning objective: I can create a diet for my creature.</p> <p>Your task: By now, the children have created a creature and its habitat. It is now time to start thinking about what that creature eats. It must be something it can find in its habitat so eating Pizza might be a little difficult. Can you draw and label what your creature likes to eat? You might also have to decide if it is a Carnivore, a Herbivore or an Omnivore.</p>	<p>Task 2- Maths Our objective: I can write and compare time (seconds and minutes).</p> <p>Your task: The children will look at comparing different times in seconds and minutes. It is worth reminding the children that there are 60 seconds in a minute. The clock in the picture will show them how the numbers are laid out.</p>	<p>Task 3- PSHE Our objective: Caring for myself.</p> <p>Your task: Last week we looked at caring for other people. This week we are going to think about caring for ourselves. We can look after ourselves in many different ways, even at such a young age. I want the children to think about different ways they can look after themselves, from pouring themselves a drink to making breakfast. Let them be reminded of how great they are.</p>

<p>Day 3 Wednesday</p>	<p>Task 1- English Our learning objective: I can plan my story.</p> <p>Your task: Using the inspiration of The Bog Baby and the creatures, habitats and diets we have created. I would like the children to start to plan their own story for how and where they found their creature. It should finish with them taking the creature home to care for it. They will need to think about how their story- <u>Starts</u>, What happens in the <u>Middle</u> and how it <u>Ends</u>.</p> <p>Planning the story is really important because I would like them to write it <u>independently</u>.</p>	<p>Task 2- Maths Our learning objective: I can write and compare time (minutes and hours).</p> <p>Your task: The work is structured in a similar way to yesterday, however, the children will be working with minutes and hours instead of seconds. The children should understand that, just like with seconds, there are 60 minutes in an hour.</p> <p>Tip: for the last question, it might be worth reminding the children that there are 90 minutes in 1 hour and 30 minutes. This will help them to work out who didn't finish on time.</p>	<p>Task 3- Topic Our learning objective: I can compare a day in the life.</p> <p>Your task: Miss Scott is spoiling us this week with her fantastic knowledge of Thailand. She is going to show us what a normal day is like for a child living in Thailand. Then, she has asked us to compare our day with the day of a Thailand child. This is an excellent opportunity to discover more about a new country and compare it to our own.</p>
