<p>Day 2 Tuesday</p>	<p>Task 1- English Our learning objective: I can find descriptive language.</p> <p>Your task: Watch the video again. Identify different descriptive language used to describe The Bog Baby. Write a list on the sheet provided.</p> <p>Tip: Adjectives are used a lot in descriptive language as they help us to describe what a noun (a person, place or thing) looks like.</p>	<p>Task 2- Maths Our objective: I can compare time.</p> <p>Your task: Compare the times on the two clocks and circle the one which is the Earlier time in the first section and which is the Later in the second.</p> <p>Challenge- Put the race times in order from 1st to 6th.</p>	<p>Task 3- PSHE Our objective: Caring for others (community).</p> <p>Caring for others is so important, especially at the moment. Although, it can be really difficult to know how you can support or care for someone.</p> <p>Your task: Write a list of lots of different ways you could care for someone in your community.</p> <p>Afterwards, I would like you to design a poster that says 'Thank You' to a group of people who are working hard during this difficult time. You might want to thank the NHS, the workers at supermarkets, The Police, The Fire department, the people who collect your bins or Mum and Dad, who love and support you.</p>

Their favourite flower, favourite food, where they live, what they like to do. Don't forget to finish a question with a question mark. ?</p>	<p>Task 2- Maths Our learning objective: I can tell the time (o'clock and half past).</p> <p>Your task: Identify the time on the o'clock section. Draw in the small hand for the o'clock. Write in the correct time. Half past- Write in the correct time on half past. Draw in the hands to make the time (the big hand must be on the 6 for it to be half past).</p> <p>Tip: If you have a clock, let the children try moving the hands to see how they move and the time changes.</p>	<p>Task 3- Topic Our learning objective: Identify the Equator.</p> <p>Your task: Using the map to help you, can you identify which countries are hot countries, and which are cold. Remember the closer to the Equator you are, the hotter your country will be.</p>
