
I can write and compare time (minutes and hours).



This clock shows us how long it takes for the hands to go around the clock. Starting at 12, it takes 60 to go around the clock. This means that it takes the minute hand 60 minutes to go around the clock to make I hour. So we know that there are 60 minutes in an hour. This will sound similar to what we know already with there being 60 seconds in I minute.
