Britain is known all over the world for its musicians, composers and pop stars. It's also well-known for adapting music styles from other places, like American rock 'n' roll, rhythm and blues, and hip-hop, and for creating its own unique sounds as well!

Different kinds of British music

Before recorded music, songs were remembered by being played. Each performance of folk music was unique, as musicians interpreted the music differently. Some famous folk songs include: *Greensleeves*, *Flower of Scotland* (the unofficial Scottish national anthem) and *Sosban Fach*.

In the 1970s, people from Manchester, Wigan and Blackpool started finding rare and lesser-known R & B records from America.

It was the first time the DJ was the centre of attention, rather than a band. This kind of music was called Northern soul.

In the late 1970s, punk rock started in London. It came from the feeling that music could be wild, silly and rule-breaking, and that it didn't have to be precise or rehearsed.

Punk bands include The Clash, The Sex Pistols, The Stranglers and The Undertones.

Grime is a British version of American hip-hop. Both focus on the way singers or rappers tell stories – in grime, though, the artist often repeats a phrase so that it has different meanings.

The Glaswegian indie rock band Franz Ferdinand formed in 2002. Known for their quirky lyrics and offbeat sound, they won two BRIT Awards, a Mercury Prize and an MTV Video Music Award. They have sold over six million records!

Music that has been written down by composers and is performed by big orchestras and choirs is known as classical music.

The most famous British composers include Edward Elgar, Ralph Vaughan Williams and Benjamin Britten.

Four boys who grew up in Liverpool, listening to American rock 'n' roll, went on to become the biggest-selling band of all time.

During the mid-1960s, The Beatles and their Merseybeat sound became more famous than any of the musicians they'd listened to.

The culture and community of 1990s Britain was channelled into music by bands like Blur, Pulp and Oasis in a brighter, catchier rock style called Britpop.

The Spice Girls, five singers from Leeds, Essex, Lancashire, London and Hertfordshire, are the biggest-selling girl group in the world!

Formed in 1994, they soon became famous for singing catchy songs about friendship, having fun and girl power.
