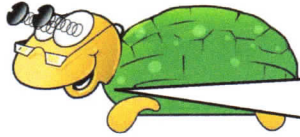


When to use I or me



It can be tricky knowing when to use the personal pronouns I or me, but there is an easy peasy way of working it out. See below!

To work out whether to use **I** or **me** remove the second person and it should be clear.

'Mum told Gary and I off for being silly.' Correct or incorrect?

Take out the second person (Gary) and rewrite the sentence:

'Mum told I off for being silly.' Not correct: it should be me, not I.

*'Mum told **me** off for being silly.'* Perfect.
