Red Poppy, 1927 by Georgia O'Keefe



Georgia O'Keefe is famous for painting natural objects. Many of her pieces are of flowers, plants, bones and landscapes. I really like her use of colour and shading. More information about her work can be found at <https://www.tate.org.uk/kids/explore/who-is/who-georgia-okeeffe>

For your artwork this week I'd like you to have a go at recreating the Red Poppy above. Look carefully at the colours chosen and the shading. Darker red in the centre, with yellows and oranges used around the edges where the light would hit. I always find pencil crayons the easiest to shade with. The harder you press on, the darker the colour. Going lightly over a colour with a brown crayon will also make the colour darker. You are welcome to use paint or pastels if you would prefer.

You will also notice that her pictures fill the whole page so think carefully about the size of paper you choose to use.

I can't wait to see what you create.
