Multiplication

For the last maths lesson of the half term focus on learning your 2s, 5s and 10 times tables. There are a whole host of games to play on these two websites to help you begin to quickly recall the multiplication facts.

Other games you can play without access to a computer or tablet involve writing out the multiplications and answers on to some paper.

Number jump - lay the answers to the multiplications around on the floor. Call out a calculation and see how quickly you can jump on it. You can also play this game with a kitchen spatula and instead of jumping, splat the correct answer.

Stair climb - put the calculations out on the steps of the stairs. Make your way to the top by working out the answer to the calculation. If you get one wrong, head back to the bottom and start again.

Memory match - jumble up the calculations and answers and lay them face down on the table or floor. Take it in turns to turn two cards over. If the answer and the calculation match you keep the cards and get another go. If they don't match, it is then the turn of the other player.

Calculate the house - place the calculations around your house. See how quickly you can find the calculations and match them up with the correct answer.

Speed tables - lay the calculations and answers out on the table. How quickly can you match them all up? See if you can beat your time.
