The trilogy was recommended to Mrs Smith as a modern 'classic' with it being compared to *The Lord of the Rings*.

The trilogy follows a young girl called Lyra through three parallel worlds. Through her adventures, which can be very challenging, Lyra is learning about what she is capable of. She is a very likable character with quite a bit of wit and a bit of 'sass'.

It's the perfect sort of book for other 'bookworms' who love getting into a chunky sets of books or for those who love epic fantasy adventures. Mrs Smith would expect other readers who like Harry Potter, Ikabog, Cressida Cowell, Abi Elphinstone, The Midnight Guardians by Ross Montgomery, The Brightstorm series by Vashti Hardy to enjoy this trilogy.
