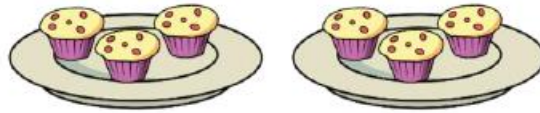


Tuesday 23rd February

Dividing by Sharing

In this lesson we are going to try drawing the objects we are sharing, but if you find this tricky you could use real objects like we did yesterday.

Remember this picture?




6 cakes have been shared equally between 2 plates. There are 3 cakes on each plate.

In maths, we use the division symbol to show when a number has been shared equally. This means that we can write our sentence about the cakes like this:

$$6 \div 2 = 3$$

Your task: Complete the table below. This is not an art lesson, so your pictures don't need to be amazing. When I draw in maths, I often draw a line or a circle to represent an object.

Sentence	Picture	Division
6 cakes have been shared equally between 2 plates.		$6 \div 2 = 3$
10 stickers have been shared equally between 5 children.		$10 \div 5 = 2$
9 balloons have been shared equally between 3 children.		$9 \div 3 = _$
8 crayons have been shared equally between 2 boxes.		
4 seeds have been shared equally between 4 pots,		
12 sweets have been shared equally between 3 bags.
