<p>The start of the story explains: The when, who, what, when, where and why. When did this happen? Who is involved in the story? Where does it take place? What do we know about the person and the place? Your stories got off to a great start, with everyone managing to explain most of the things I've mentioned in this plan here.

To make this very easy for you (some people call me Mr Jones the Merciful), I've made you a list that show you how to write good middle for your story....

- At LEAST one paragraph where you should describe how things start going wrong for your character and what the disaster actually is. (This could be a plane crash or avalanche, sudden flood or storm or whatever you have chosen).
- At LEAST one visual description (what something looks like)
- At LEAST one other sensory description (what something sounds like).
- At LEAST two sentences explaining the damage to the character (broken legs/arms/head wounds etc and what that means for them). This could even be a whole paragraph if you were writing well..
- At LEAST two sentences explaining the dangers your characters face. This could be from animal attack, dehydration, asteroid collision, drowning, hypothermia, frostbite, heat exhaustion etc. You could certainly write a whole paragraph on this. It's important for the story.

YOU SHOULD NOW WRITE HOW YOUR CHARACTER ACTUALLY SURVIVES! You will write about the things that they do to save themselves tomorrow!
