# FIRST WORD

This is a fun poetry game that you can do to get yourself warmed up. First of all you need to write a short sentence. A statement works best. I don't want to hear any of your 'I don't know what to write' nonsense. If you don't know what to write, just write: (But I know you'll think of something better than that)

*I saw a cat.*

You should write your sentence here ->

That is the first line of your little poem.

Then you need to write the second line.

Well the second line *must* begin with the last word of your first line. So it's:

*I saw a cat,*

*Cat for breakfast, very nice,*

The next line must begin with the last word of the previous line. So it could be:

*I saw a cat,*

*Cat for breakfast, very nice,*

*Nice to see so many birds out and about,*

*About time that the Amazon man turned up,*

*Up since half past six,*

*Six lines are enough for my poem.*



See how it works? Now you try. Don't think too hard, write loads and choose your favourite. Are there any clever tricks you can think of? Have fun with it!
