Year 6 designs were exquisite in detail, and even our EYFS class told us how they had tested different materials and shapes to make sure that their structures would work. At the end of the morning, the judges unanimously presented the Young Engineer's award to Thomas in Year 3. He had combined his knowledge of growing food, using bees for pollination with a secure structure that would capture the energy of the sea and withstand the waves. Impressive, indeed!


