On the back of this letter is the calendar for 2022/2023. I hope that it will enable you to plan ahead when it comes to booking holidays. You will appreciate that attendance is key to a child's success and as a parent or carer you are responsible by law for ensuring that they are here. A recent Education Bill has highlighted strategies to ensure absence and term time holidays are kept to truly exceptional circumstances. In the near future, the County Council will issue automatic fines where registers show that unauthorised absences exceed three days within a six-week period. It will no longer at my discretion. Similarly, persistent lateness will be challenged. We will do our best to support you, but request that you do your utmost to ensure that holidays are booked within the 13 weeks that schools are closed.
