Using MakeCode we will look at how programming and coding works. We will be debugging and altering code to solve problems.

Plants

Discovering parts of a plant and their functions before investigating germination.

We will explore how our families are connected.

Subordination and co-ordination

Sentence writing work using conjunction to expand on our ideas.

Professional Crocodile

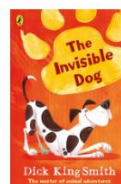
A picture book to look at our inference skills and write picture captions.
