As ever, Year 5 will continue to work on age related grammar, spelling, sentence level work to improve the reading and writing elements of our year group's objectives. Writing for a purpose continues to be a key part to boost enthusiasm, bringing the elements of the English curriculum together for some stunning extended writing.

# The Wider Curriculum

#### ...as artists

We will study artists such as Julian Opie and Seurat, researching their fantastic careers and producing sketches and finishes pieces to be proud of!

## ...as computer specialists

We will learn all about the software, 'Excel' and become experts at creating spreadsheets that aid us in our everyday lives.

## ...as fitness experts

We will learn all about the game 'Bench Ball' with Mr. Litchfield and work alongside Mr. Clarke to gain a deeper understanding of gymnastics. Indoor team games will be teaching the children about attack and defence, spatial awareness and competition.

We will extend our musical knowledge through singing. Children will learn about rhythm, pitch and tempo as we listen and perform.

During this unit of work, we will be grappling with some of the most universe-bending forces ever defined: gravity. Along with this, we will look at water and air resistance and conduct a series of engaging experiments to see these forces in action.
