

HOME SCHOOL AGREEMENT 2023

At Willow Brook School we believe that pupils achieve most when children, parents, carers and staff work together with respect, positivity and shared determination towards the agreed aims of the school. In a strong, family-oriented community, our common aim is to support each child's progress and potential. The purpose of our updated Home School Agreement is to outline what is expected from pupils, parents, carers and the school so that we achieve the very best outcomes and that the primary school experience is a happy and successful foundation that inspires lifelong learning.

At Willow Brook School our aims are embodied in our ethos:

- CARE We aim to foster a climate of consideration and respect, where children and their adult role models care for each other and environment they share.
- CONFIDENCE We aim to provide a broad and balanced curriculum and a close-knit environment that inspires a love of learning and
 provides a range of experiences to build knowledge and confidence both in and out of the classroom.
- **COMMUNITY** We aim to reflect and uphold the shared values and diversity of our community so that children explore and develop the understanding, tolerance and respect that enables them to grow into positive citizens. We aim to foster effective links between home, school and the wider community so that children develop a sense of belonging.
- **COMMITMENT** We aim to encourage resilience and determination through challenge and high expectation. We would like our children to find the satisfaction of mastering goals and finding independence, as well as understanding that new skills often require practice and patience.
- **CREATIVITY** We aim to develop learners who see the value in creativity who learn to appreciate how problem solving, critical thinking, exploration, aesthetics and collaboration stimulates essential human development and a sense of wellbeing.

In understanding our aims and the school's responsibilities, we trust that parents and carers will be effective partners in their child's education.

Our Ethos and Rules

Our aims lead quite neatly to six simple rules. We know that young children need reminders as they learn how to interact and put shared expectations into practice, so our 5 C's are displayed prominently around the school and rules are discussed regularly so that they remind and guide us as we work and play together.

We are honest, tell the truth and are kind to each other	so we can trust and respect each other
We look after our school and our belongings	so we have a pleasant and motivating place to learn
