

### A Polite Plea on Attendance and Lateness

You will have seen in the media over the past year in particular, that there is growing concern over school attendance and punctuality. In law, your child has a right to an education and it is your duty as a parent or carer to do your utmost to ensure give your child the best chance as they start their life-long learning. Children are required to be in school for 190 days of the year, leaving (an almost equal) 175 in which to organise holidays.

If your child's absence in those 190 days falls **below 90%**, **this is called 'persistent absence'**. By the end of the year, 90% attendance equates to having one day off in every fortnight, which is quite significant.

Attendance and punctuality is reported termly to a school's Governors and we are answerable to the Department of Education and Ofsted for how we manage our registers and challenge on-going issues. But far more importantly, AND WITHOUT A DOUBT, this level of absence has a long term impact on your child's education and life chances.

We will continue to work with you to minimise absence and lateness.

To be clear about our policy on lateness:

- If your child arrives after the bell and subsequently misses the 8.50am register, a late mark will be recorded.
- If you arrive after 9.15am without informing us in advance of an exceptional reason, this has to be recorded as an unauthorised absence for the morning session.

After Easter, you will be asked to report the reason for your lateness and this will be recorded as part of our monitoring. If you need any help, support or advice, we would be more than happy to work with you. Together we can make a difference.

We will see you bright and ready for the summer term on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> April.
