## WELCOME BACK!

## AUTUMN TERM CLUBS

If we ask for nothing else during your child's time with us, we hope that you will encourage them to value reading... it is the bedrock of learning and it is no surprise that those who read regularly find success. Thank you to those who have offered their services as Reading Volunteers for the year ahead. Mrs. Roper will be in touch to finalise safeguarding checks, and I'll contact you all next week to arrange a 'what you need to know' meeting. We appreciate your time.

## ATTENDANCE

At Willow Brook pupil attendance is above average. That makes us happy and gives your children an excellent start in life. With so few children ending the year as 'persistent absentees' (i.e. with attendance below 90%) the school has, to date, not served fines on the few term time holidays that are requested. This does not mean that we do not take attendance seriously. You will find a copy of our term time calendar on the school website. Please do your utmost to book holidays in

the 13 weeks available to you. Please also note that if you request to take your child out of school early on a Friday afternoon, the p.m. session will be counted as an unauthorised absence.

## PHONES AND WATCHES

This is an opportune time to remind you that we do not allow children to bring mobile phones into school under any circumstances, nor do we permit children to wear smart watches. There are so many safeguarding and developmental reasons behind our policy, as well as recognising that such items are incredibly expensive. (Having watched many young children over the years try to navigate and manage an unsupervised social media world without the maturity and knowledge that it demands, we would **URGE** you to resist giving your child a phone until they are at secondary school.)
