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## DOUBLE YELLOW LINES and PARKING

Due to on-going parking issues on Willow Brook and at the top of the Fairway, we have now been notified that yellow lines will be painted opposite the school and double yellow lines will be added on the Fairway junction. As I have said many times before, whilst I have no jurisdiction on parking, I would like to think that your thoughts centre entirely on making sure that a) Willow Brook children have clear vision so that they can safely cross the road and b) we are considerate of our neighbours when you park at busy times.

I have also received an email from the bus company, who, again, have asked me to pass on the message that it is an offence to park in a designated bus lane/stopping space. I appreciate that it's tempting to pull up at the bus stop if you are late, but again, please consider how this impacts on the room needed for buses to manoeuvre in a busy space safely. The council will be doing spot checks over the next term and will issue £70 fines for cars contravening parking regulations.
